

Last Will and Testament of James Taylor, decd.
Georgia Carroll County.

In the name of God Amen: I James Taylor of said State and County, being of an advanced age and knowing that I must ere long depart this life, deem it right and proper, both as respects my family and myself, that I should make some disposition of the property with which a kind providence has blessed me &c. therefore make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others made by me.

- 1st Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. My soul I trust shall return to God who gave it.
- 2 Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my executor hereinafter appointed.
- 3 Item I give bequeath and devise to my Wife Sally W. Taylor all my property that I am possessed of at my death; during her natural life or widowhood; or until my youngest child shall become of age; Then I desire all my property that I may be possess of sold and divided equally with my children. Those having advancements made to them during my life time to account for the same at the final division. I also give my wife the right to trade and transfer any personally property that I may be possessed at my death that she thinks will be of benefit to the estate to trade the same.
- 4 Item: If my Wife Sally W. Taylor should marry after my death; I give and bequeath to her during her life one half of lot of land No 215 The place where I now reside, also the mill property with all the appertanances thereunto.
- 5 Item And if my wife Sally W. Taylor should live a widow until my youngest child should become of age I desire her to have the property described in Item 4 during her natural life in lieu of her dower; and in either event; that she should live a Widow or marry; at her death said property described in Item 4 to be sold and divided among my children or their heirs.
- 6 Item I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Sally W. Taylor my executor of this my last will and testament this 29 day of

June 1886.
