with which a kind providence has blessed me I therefore make this my
last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all others by
me heretofore made.

At first I desire and don't that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances, and condition in life. My soul I trust shall return to rest with God, who gave it, & I hope for salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Secondly, I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without unnecessary delay by my Executors herein after named and appointed.

Finally I give beneath and devise to my beloved wife Lucy Elbogen
Lot of land numbered Twenty-two (22) in the Sixth (6) District
of Carroll County Georgia containing Two hundred and two and
one half acres more or less and all improvements thereon also
all other lands which I had title to and improvements thereon
together with all the perishable property debts and evidences of
debt of which I may be possessed of at the time of my demise
you and during the lifetime of my said wife except as herein
provided

To my dear children of Mary Elizabeth Baxter now deceased
and wife to W. H. Baxter my daughter as I have given off said W. H.
Baxter for the use of his said family five hundred (\$500) dollars
in lands and personal property I desire this to be their distribution
Share of my estate until the balance of my children shall have
received a like share each in case three of said children die without
leaving the property hereafter given them shall revert back to my estate
in common with the balance of my heirs.

Twelfthly, To my daughter Amanda all the money my daughter
as I have given off to said daughter for the use of her family
and household goods, and land, in land and personal property, shall
be to be her distribution share of my estate until the balance of
my children shall have received a like share each.

Monthly to my daughter Sarah Francis Robinson my daughter as
I have given off to said daughter for the use of her family.

fine hundred (\$100) dollars in land and personal property I desire this to be her distribution share of my estate untill the balance of my Children Shall have received a like share each.

Seventhly To my son James Thomas Morgan my son as I have given off to said son for the use of his family fine hundred (\$100) Dollars in land and personal property I desire this to be his distribution share of my estate untill the balance of my Children Shall have received a like share each.

Eighthly It is my will and desire that as each of my heirs arise at the age of manhood or of age that my Executors make them equal with those who have been given off property out of my estate by giving them about such property as the others received.

Ninthly It is my will and desire that at the death of my wife that all the property both real and personal shall be sold by my Executors and equally divided among my heirs.

Tenthly It is my desire and will that the \$1000. or which will be due me from the Knights of Honor to be divided as follows To Sarah Francis Robinson my daughter (\$200) three hundred Dollars To James Thomas Morgan my son three hundred (\$300) dollars To Walter Robinson Morgan my son three hundred (\$300) dollars To Lewis Davis Morgan my son three (\$300) hundred dollars To Lewis L. Morgan my daughter three hundred (\$300) dollars and to the widow the remaining five hundred (\$500) dollars and at the death of the widow the aforesaid (\$500) to be equally divided between the aforesaid children.

Eleventhly I hereby constitute and appoint my son James Thomas Morgan and Gustavus L. Morgan Executors of this my last will and Testament
This June 28th 1890.
