State of Georgia Carroll County June 8 1885  
 I Thomas Kennedy do this day and date the  
 eight day of June eighteen hundred & eighty  
 five make my last will to my wife present wife  
 Lydia A Kennedy - I Will her 60 fifty acres of land  
 in the North East corner of Lot 18 lands to 178  
 one hundred & twenty three in the tenth district  
 of said County wherein is my residence & will  
 all other property on the place including  
 one mule cows hogs & all house & kitchen furniture  
 to have & to hold for her & her children during  
 her natural life and at her death the above  
 property that is stated in this will goes to  
 my three daughters equally by Thomas Kennedy  
 Lucia A Kennedy, Martha A Kennedy, Francis A Kennedy  
 My wife Lydia A Kennedy has the privilege & liberty  
 to sell any of the stock, or exchange for other stock  
 to suit her and her children. These three children  
 has the right to do as they please with the  
 property named in this will after their mothers  
 death Lydia A Kennedy,

 without the force of any compulsion of sound and

Upon the foregoing affidavit of Wm Flanigan  
one of the subscribing witnesses to the will in  
will of Thomas Kennedy died it is ordered by the  
court that said will be admitted to record  
as satisfactorily proven in common form and it is  
further ordered that usual citation be published  
in appointing Lydia J Kennedy administrator of  
said Thomas Kennedy died with the will annexed  
This the 22nd day of August 1886.
