I wish Isabella my Daughter Isabella Hay to have my
Mill and tract or lot of land number ninety five in the
tenth District of Carroll County with all the appurtenances there-
to belonging to her own use and her four children that she now
has to wit William, Benjamin, Charles and David to
their own proper use and benefit while she lives and at her
death the title to vest in her four children above named
Item 4th

I will my Gordon lot of land Number Three hundred
and nine in the Thirteenth District and third section originally
Herokes County now Gordon County to my Daughter Carrie Long
now the wife of John B. Shields and to her bodily heirs to have and
to hold the same for ever in fee simple

Item 5th The ballance of my effects with the above named property to be kept together by my wife Nancy E. Long during her lifetime for her support and at her death if any thing is left to equally divided between Benjamin M. Long Isabella Hay and Carrie E. Shields and Robert L. G. Long to share equal in the effects not named & the division by sale or agreement as the parties agree upon and I hereby appoint B. M. Long my Executor to carry out this my will In testimony whereof I the said John Long hath hereunto set my hand and seal this the thirteenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven
