

Last Will and Testament of J. J. Malone, Sr.
 State of Georgia, }
 Carroll County. }

In the name of God, Amen.
 I, Jeremiah D. Malone, Sen. of the
 State and County aforesaid being sane of body and
 mind do make this my last will and Testament.
 1st, I bequeath by body to the dust and my soul to
 God who gave it.

2nd, I will that all my debts be paid and my contracts
 fully met.

3rd, I will and bequeath to my beloved wife, Mary
 Malone, the house and lot on which I now reside,
 in Villa Rica, with all the stock thereon and all
 the household and kitchen furniture and One
 Thousand Dollars in cash, in fee simple, to dispose
 of at her own discretion. And also the use of all
 the estate during her natural life or widowhood,
 with the privilege of giving off any part or por-
 tion of said estate equally to the children, after
 the youngest child becomes of age, subject to the
 following exceptions. Except. 1, I will that my property
 known as my gin property be sold and that my son
 C. G. Malone have three hundred dollars of the proceeds
 in accordance with the obligation he holds against
 me. Except. 2 That my son G. B. Malone sufficient
 with what he has already received to amt. to
 Four Hundred Dollars, the amount given to the other
 children, and if the aforesaid property should
 not be sold, that my son G. B. Malone have his
 out of the other property when he becomes of
 age or as soon as expedient thereafter.

4th I will that my wife be my executrix and
 her sons C. G. & W. H. Malone be her assistants
 in managing the business. Also that she be al-
 lowed to take full control of said estate with-
 out taking out letters of administration and
 to manage it for her own benefit.

5th I will that at the death of my beloved wife
 or during her life at her own option that
 all my property except what I have willed
 to my wife in her own individual right
 be divided equally between my children or
 heirs at law. Namely: R. B. Malone, C. E. Williams,
 M. A. Malone, C. G. Malone, John W. Malone, W. H. Malone,
 J. D. Malone, Jr. Lucy E. Pritchett and G. B. Malone,
 with the exception, that J. Norcross and S. B.
 Hoyt, if they be living, receive of R. B. Malone's
 interest in the estate, if any, the sum of
 money they advanced for R. B. Malone, without

interest should his interest in the estate amount to that much, unless they waive their claim, or he previously settle the same, amount of claim found on Government receipt found with my papers.
