Item Second

I give bequeath and devise to my son A. A. McCollister sixty acres of land in the South East portion of my possessions on lot of land No Eighty five the lines to be so run as to embrace a portion of wood land on said land not bequeathed in Item First, also Twelve and one half acres in the north end of my possessions in lot of land No Seventy six.

Item Third

I give bequeath and devise to my son William McCollister sixty acres of land on the west side of lot of land No Eighty five embracing all my possessions in said land not bequeathed in Items First and Second also Twelve and one half acres in the South end of my possessions in lot of land No Seventy six, also my mule drive

Item Fourth
