In the name of God Amen
I William W Moor of the County and State aforesaid being of sound and disposing mind, do make and publish this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all wills and Testaments heretofore made by me. And first of all I commit my soul to God who gave it, and my body to a decent burial

Item 1st I will that all my just debts be paid promptly and that the same be done without any delay whatever

Item 2^d I will and bequeath that my wife Mary J Moor retain in her own right two feather beds & bedsteads & a sufficiency of bed clothing for the same, also corn, flour, meat, salt, Lard, sugar, & coffee sufficient for a years support, also one cow with dark sides & white face, after which I desire her to have an equal share with my children, provided she remains a widow, if however she should marry again, then it is not my intention for her to have any thing except what is named above to wit the beds bedsteads bed clothes & cow above named.

Item 3^d That in consideration of my having heretofore given to my son George J Moor, the sum of seventy five dollars, I desire that before any distribution is made to him or his children that the balance of my children be paid one hundred dollars, after which, I desire that his share of my estate, be given to his children, & the same to be put out at interest until they arrive of age, & then given to them equally,

Item 4th I will and bequeath to my son William J Moor, twenty acres of land more or less, it being part of the lot on which he now lives, bounded as follows viz commencing at the branch between him the said William J Moor & John J Dunkins, and running the road that runs by the house of William J Moor, to the west line of said lot thence south to the lands belonging to George Moor thence east to the above named branch & thence along said branch to the beginning corner to receive the same before any distribution is made

Item 5th I will that my Executor after complying with the former part of my will proceed to sell all my estate both real and personal either at public outcry or privately as he may think most advisable for the interest of my estate, and divide the same equally between my wife and children, subject to the above conditions

Item 6th I will and desire that the children of my deceased Daughter Mary H Pace have one share of my estate and that my Executor see that the same be put at interest until they arrive at full age and that the same with the interest be equally divided between them
