hereinafter appointed as soon as possible

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Frances Smith
the same mare, saddle and bridle And Buggy & Harness & one cow & calf
One sow & pig One Bed, Bedstead & Bedding One spinning Wheel & Cards
One Wash pot one oven & lid one skillet & lid one Tea kettle, one Table and
two chairs and provisions to do her Twelve months

4th I Will and bequeath unto my beloved sons Jasper N. Smith
and Martin M. Smith & Nathaniel C. Smith to have the remainder of
my property equally divided between them after paying Sarah Ann
Glover and Prissilla E. Swords & Rebecca M. Smith five dollars apiece

5th I hereby appoint my Beloved son Martin M. Smith my beloved
brother Wesley Smith of said County my Executors of this my
last Will and Testament or either of them who may qualify enter
into Bond with good and sufficient security faithfully to perform
the trust herein by Will reposed as required by law in case of
Administration Sept 20th 1866
