to the plantation Hogs, hens, & all over Cows & calves and all the corn
wheat & fodder on hand at my death, Also my library of Books
to have and to hold all the above named property during her natural
life or widowhood and at her death all the above named property to
be sold by my executors James A. Jones and divided equally between
all my children and my little Grand son William O' Jones. And if my

same wife should marry again It is my will and desire that the said property shall then be sold by my said Executor and my wife to have a child's part of the said property

Item 2^d I will and bequeath to my son Hiram B. Jones twenty five acres of land in the north west corner of lot number two hundred and fifty five in the fifth district of Carroll County also the said lot which I now have

Item 3^d I also will and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Ann Rebbeck one Bed and Stand and furniture and one Cow and Calf

Item 4th It is my will & desire that my daughter & her live upon my said Estate with my wife and be raised and educated out of the same and that my little grand son William A. be also raised out of my Estate above valued and educated out of his own means and that my James A. Superintendent & look over and manage all the business and dispose of such stock as may accumulate more than the family can use or manage

Item 5th It is my desire that my said son H. Jones act as Executor of this will. — signed sealed and published as my last will and testament in the presence of the undersigned witnesses their signing in the presence of the testator and in the presence of each other this 26th day of October 1863.
