Jones and divided equally between all my children and my little Grand son William O. Jones. And if my

since wife should marry again It is my will and desire that the said property shall then be sold by my said Executor and my wife to have a child's part of the said property

Item 3rd I will and bequeath to my son Hiram B. Jones twenty five acres of land in the north west corner of lot number two hundred and fifty five in the fifth district of Carroll County also the parcel of land which I now have

Item 3rd I also will and bequeath to my daughter Faxon Ann Rebecca one Bed and a stand and furniture and one cow and calf

Item 4th It is my will & desire that my daughter Faxon Ann upon my said Estate with my wife and be raised and educated out of the same and that my little grand son William C. be also raised and educated out of my Estate above named and educated out of his own means and that my James A. supervise & look over and manage all the business and dispose of such stock as we may accumulate more than the family can use or manage

Item 5th It is my desire that my son James A. Jones act as Executor of this will. — signed sealed and published as my last will and testament in the presence of the undersigned witnesses. they signing in the presence of the testator and in the presence of each other this 26th day of October 1863.
