bearing date December 1st of the same year and of the following:  
The Testimony of the late said George was read and  
superseding all other and previous Testimony it is so read  
from the Books - Library, and the Secretary makes  
it open and freely and frankly recites the same as follows:

Art 1st. I will make this my last will that all  
please Almighty God to separate my immortal  
spirit from my mortal body, permit my  
spirit to go where you it need that my mortal  
body be placed in the metallic coffin by my friends  
and in the room at my death house which is a house  
built of stone 10 by 10 feet well made and new, at the  
beginning of St. Peter's or Church, in Carroll County  
said house to be all by the sides of the grave of  
Dr. J. W. Brown who died in said church yard  
with a shot in the East end - and at the West  
side a wall six feet high foot wide there shall  
my body be provided by my surviving friends

Art. 2nd.

Sayeth my desire, after my death shall  
leave me in the world in them places where I shall stay  
as comfortable as practicable.

Articles 3d. I give unto my Son William H.  
Pool my Mace, Saddle and bridles.

Art. 4. I will and desire that my beloved  
wife Sarah shall leave, keep and retain  
all the remainder of my property and effects  
of every kind, and shall do and describe  
so long as she shall live, or remain a widow  
and at her death or marriage. I desire all  
my effects to be equally divided among  
my children that they may then be living  
and the heirs of such as may then be dead.  
I will that their children who are living  
receive the share of their deceased parent  
equally divided among them.

Art 5 - I hereby nominate, constitute and  
appoint my Son W. H. Pool and J. G. Brown  
my Executors.

In testimony whereof I have  
signed, sealed and published the foregoing  
as my last will and testament this  
the 14th day of September in the year of  
our Lord eighteen hundred & seventy two

Court Roll of Ordinances  
At Chambers April 1st 1873

Before me, at Chambers, personally came D. H.  
Jackson and W. H. Haff, for the purpose of  
proving the last will and testament of T. J.  
Pool - Wherein they are witnesses - The said  
will having been before that time brought  
before me for probate - who has filed his petition  
for probate of the same - The said witnesses  
depose and say that they saw the said T.  
J. Pool sign and publish the same, as his  
last will, on the day and year therein stated  
in instrument themselves by him - that they witnessed  
the same at his request, in his presence, and in  
presence of each other, that the same was volun-  
tarily executed by him while he was of sound  
dispossession mind and memory.
