disposing mind and memory, I have in to wit
for the same - thinking, and deliberating, made
sign and seal, and publish this my last
Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other
former Wills by me made as follows.

Art 1st. I will and desire that I will shall
please Almighty God to separate my immortal
Spirit from any mortal body, I commit my
Spirit to God who gave it and that my mortal
body be placed in the metallic coffin by me purch-
ased in Atlanta at ninety dollars and a house
built of stone to be 12 feet - will be erected at the
burial place of my former church, in Carroll County
said house to be built by the sides of the graves of
Dr. J. G. W. Brown children, in said church with
with a door in the East end - and at the West
side a wall raised one foot - and there I desire
my body to be deposited by my surviving friends

Art. 2nd.

I will and desire, after my death that all
my executors should in their joint action as little delay
as possible practicable

Article 3^d. I give unto my son William H. Pool my Mare, Saddle and bridle.

Art. 4. I will and desire that my beloved wife Sarah shall have, keep and retain all the remainder of my property and effects of every kind, and kinds and descriptions so long as she shall live, or remain a widow and at her death or marriage I desire all my effects to be equally divided among my children that that surviving then be living and the heirs of such as may then be dead. I will that their children respectively may receive the share of their deceased parent equally divided among them.

Art 5. I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my son W. H. Pool and J. G. W. Brown my Executors.
