my last will and testament.

1st Item: I desire and direct that my body be buried
in a decent and Christianlike manner, suitable to my
circumstances in life. My soul & trust shall return to God
who gave it, as I hope for eternal salvation through the
merit & atonement of the blessed Lord, and Savior Jesus Christ
whose religion I have professed, and as I humbly may
enjoyed for twelve years.

2nd Item: I desire and direct that all my just debts
be paid without delay by my executors herein after ap-
pointed.

3rd Item: I give, bequeath and direct to my beloved
wife Francis A. Reid and my two children, Francis
E. Reid and Henry Wade Reid, the half of lot of land
No. 278 in the Seventh District and the eighth half of
a land No. 235 in the Seventh District, all of said county.
If the value of the said lands should be enhanced by
the discovery of minerals to any thing over the amount of
one hundred dollars the overplus to be equally allo-
cated among all my legal heirs, I also bequeath
to my wife and two above named children my
household and kitchen furniture and my stock of
all kinds, and of personal effects of all kinds be-
longing to said premises.

4th Item: I have given to all my heirs by my first
wife one hundred dollars each as their part of my

estate, and have taken their receipts for the same,
5th Item: I hereby waive the necessity of making invi-
tations or returns of my estate,

6th Item: I hereby constitute and appoint my son
George M. Reid and my worthy friend Drane,
W^m Drane & executors of this my last will and testament.
