

Georgia 2 The Will of Robert Moore made
Carroll County and declared by him, on
the 20th of March in the year
of our Lord eight hundred and Seventy
Three, in compliance with the following
circumstances, as set forth in the words
of said Will, Robert Moore died at his own Home
in Carroll County, Georgia, on the 20th of March
1873, leaving an estate of his real and per-
sonal property, from which he had suffered a short
time, while the said signature was present
writing, and since after certain times is
to be considered as to whether he should have
declared in his last Will his full and
words.

Said signature was collected and
all was done, and

Said Will of said Robert Moore to be passed
and read by another will my daughter
Caroline, as long as they live, or as long as
any with them, and all things upon the
place to remain as they are, and Abram
to sell and dispose of the stock in his
proper, and if my son Abram fails to
take care of his mother, any of my other
children will have the right to take the
said and take care of their mother.

I want my friends J. C. Shackelford, Peter
Gray, Elsiea Hager to advise and counsel
my son Abram, and assist him in the
settling up my business about four days
after speaking these words the said Robert
Moore died.
