

Allen Rowe's Will

State of Georgia } In the name of God Amen.
 Carroll County } I, Allen Rowe, being of sound
 mind and disposing memory,

but knowing that it is appointed once for man
 to die, do make this my last will and testament.
 In doing of which I recommend my soul to God who
 gave it, hoping to receive eternal life through Jesus Christ
 my redeemer. In disposing of my estate first of all I
 desire that all of my just debts be paid out of my estate.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my faithful and beloved wife
 Nuldah R. Rowe all of my estate, both real and personal of
 every description, with all of the incomes from the same
 for her support and comfort, and if she should marry a
 future husband, it shall not deprive her of the benefits
 herein contained, but he shall not have any control of
 estate nor the proceeds thereof but his board only.

3rd Item, I will and desire that my wife shall have
 full liberty to sell said real estate and purchase other
 land with the proceeds thereof whenever she may deem
 the same to be best for her support and comfort or
 any other property for the same purpose

Item 4. I will and desire that when my son John M. and my
 daughter Virginia L. shall arrive at full age or if their mother
 shall die before that time that each of them shall have a
 bed and bed clothes also cow & calf provided that nothing
 herein contained shall be so construed shall be so construed as
 to take from my wife the things contained in this item
 as to leave her without a sufficiency for her support and
 comfort.

Item 5. I will and desire that my son John M. shall
 have a mule or horse worth seventy five dollars or
 that amount in money and if that cannot reason-
 ably be done when becomes of full age, then at his
 mothers death that he have the sum of \$75⁰⁰ over
 and above the rest of the children provided that
 my son J. M. shall be kind and dutiful to his
 mother but if on the contrary he should be dis-
 obedient and care not for his her welfare then
 in that case I leave the whole matter with his mother
 to dispose of as she thinks best.

Item 6th I will and desire that nothing contained in
 the above items shall be so construed as to pay any
 claims against me that existed on or before the
 first day of June 1865, my reason for this item is
 because some claims existed at said time 1865-
 which has been paid of but the paper was not
 cancelled.

Item 7th I will and desire that all the bedding
 and bedclothing wearing apparel and house furniture

Shall be equally divided between my present wife's children
namely Sarah A. Smith, William N. Rowe, Martha N. Conley,
Emma L. Spruce John M. Rowe and Virginia L. Rowe, not
because they are better or nearer to me than my other
and older children but because they had to be raised
after the late disastrous war and could not have the
opportunities nor the help that the older ones had.
Item 8th and lastly I appoint my faithful and beloved
wife Hulda R. Rebecca Rowe my executor hoping and
believing that she will execute the same with fidelity
and desiring that my wife at my death will take
full possession of my said estate. Given under

1880.
