should make a disposition of the property which a kind Providence
has blessed me to. Therefore make this my last will and Testament hereby
Revoking all others heretofore made by me.

Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent
and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition
in life my soul I trust shall return to rest with God who Gave it
as I hope for Eternal Salvation through the merits and Atonement
of the blessed Lord & Savior Jesus Christ whose Religion I have
Professed & as I hereby witness Entreated for his sake

Item 2^d I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
without delay by my executors herein after named & appointed
As I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed in their rights
Especially as there is no reason for delay

Item 3rd I give bequeath and devise unto my beloved wife Nancy
With whom I have lived in the strictest quiet for Twenty nine
years Lot of land To One hundred and Eighty six in the
Sixth district of Carroll County Containing Two hundred Two and
one half acres with all the rights & emmets and appurtenances to said
lot of land in any wise belonging free from all charge and limitation
whatever during her lifetime or widowhood I also give and bequeath
to my beloved wife in the same reserved manner the house hold and
Kitchen furniture and all the Stock and farming utensils used on and
belonging to said Plantation of every description whatever and five
mules such as she may choose from all my mules & Stock other Stock
as she may deem prudent and necessary for the use of herself &
family and my Carriage & horses Also one yellow Bay negro Paul
And one negro woman Rose & one negro girl name of Jane and their
increase and one negro boy name of Samp So hold the same during
her natural life or widowhood and in Case of her marriage the
above property bequeathed to her to be sold and an equal division
of the sum to be made with her and the surviving children

Item 4th Having given my eldest daughter Martha now Mrs.
Fielder one thousand dollars worth of Property It is therefore my
will that my executors give to each one of my children upon their
arrival at age the sum of One thousand dollars worth of Property

That they thereby may share alike The minor Children to be educated
and supported out of the balance of the Property
Item 5th It is my will that each of the minor children appoint their
Guardians

Item 6th After the death of my beloved wife in case she does not marry
the whole of my Real and Personal Property to be equally divided among
my Children & share and Share alike
Item 7th I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Anna C.
and my Son in Law Francis M. Hobbs and my Son George E. Hobbs
Executors of this my last will and Testament
