

Georgia } We the undersigned Witnesses swear that
Cannall County we were present during the last illness of
John F. Spruwell died a short time before
his death, which took place in said County and
State on the 3^d day of May 1882, at his home, and
in the house of his habitation or dwelling, and
that the said J. F. Spruwell called on each of us to
his sick bed, and said that he was going to die,
soon, that he would never recover, that he ought
to have made his Will, but had never done so,
and then and there called on each of us to bear witness
that he ~~executed~~ his property and effects disposed of
in the following manner. I want my wife Martha
F. to have full and complete control and
management of all my property. She has good
judgement, and can manage every thing, and make
a good support for herself and little children.
She is to have all the land and stock, provisions,
house-hold and kitchen furniture &c, and all other property
of all kinds whatsoever, during her life or until she
marries. I want her to maintain and educate the
children, she is to be perfectly free to use everything
for the use of herself and our children. I want
everything in my business to stand as it is, and my
said wife to manage all the business just I
could. If my said wife marries again, I want
everything sold, and an equal division to be made
of the proceeds between her and our six children
or such of them as may be living she to have a
child's part. This statement was made and repeated

to us at different times, during the last two weeks of his illness and under a seemingly full consciousness of his approaching death
