I say I am now the names Mr. & Mrs. Johnson of our
State and County I am now a widow of about 80 years old
and have been the widow of that man for 20 years
I am now the widow of a doctor at night and physician
in regards myself and family that I should
make a diagnosis of my patient I therefore
make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking
and counteracting all others here before made.

A decent and Christianlike manner my last I trust
 shall return to rest with God who gave it
 Item 3rd I desire and direct that all my first
 debts be paid Item 4th I desire that my wife Alvina
 take in her possession Control and management after
 my death the whole of the property and effects known as
 my estate Item 4th I desire that my wife Alvina provide
 as much for my Children in Clothing and educating them
 as Circumstances will admit until the youngest one of
 them shall have become of age At which time I desire
 and direct that my wife still hold in her own possession
 Security for Acres of Land Cropping my tract of land
 from North to South so as to include all the Buildings
 upon my premises and my negro Woman Sarah
 with her increase Item 5th I desire and direct that
 when my youngest Child has become of age that all
 my land not given to my wife together with the
 Horses hogs Cattle and Sheep and all the produce from
 the farm thereon hand be sold to the highest bidder
 and an equal division be made among my children
 Also my wife to have a Childs part of all except
 the land Item 6th I desire and direct that all the
 property herein excepted as bequeathed to my wife
 consisting of land Negroes Household furniture
 Kitchen furniture farm tools &c at her death be
 equally divided among my children This October

 of the said will said Testator was of sound and disposing
 mind and memory That deponents signed and will
 as witnesses in the presence of the Testator and at his Special
 instance and Request and in the presence of such other soon to
 be deceased by him this fifth day of Alexander Colclough
