First.

 suit now pending against said real estate.

Second.

I give bequeath and devise to my daughter Mary
 F. Burnett the following property, viz: one gold
 watch first, one double wheel Countess frame, also one
 small Chest with, one hymnal Book and one
 Methodist Discipline.

Third.

I give bequeath and devise to my son S. W. Johnson
 the following property, viz: Two framed beds, seven quilts
 & one double wheel Countess frame, one corner table & two side tables.

Fourth.

I give bequeath and devise to my daughter Dora A. Johnson
 the following property, viz: Two framed beds, two quilts,
 one double wheel Countess frame, two Bedsteads
 and Trunk, Organ, one family Bible, two Tables
 and all my dishes.

Fifth.

I give bequeath and devise to my son J. W. Johnson
 the same as above.

And it is further my will and desire that if
 S. W. Johnson or Dora A. Johnson die leaving
 no heirs that all property I bequeath to them go
 to Mary F. Burnett's heirs.
