 my son in law shall take my wife Temperance and
 keep her her life time and be paid for the same out
 of my estate and if he fails to comply that arrange-
 ments be made for the same & paid for out of my
 effects

Then fourth - I give and bequeath to my son R. R. Cobb
 five dollars

Then fifth - I give and bequeath to Solomon West
 children that he had by my daughter Ann five dol-
 lars each I give and bequeath my negro property
 to my sons James B. & G. J. Cobb and daughter Sarah
 and Ruffly Barber to be divided according
 to the will of God (not sold)
