dollars
Item 4th I give and devise to my beloved daughter Rhoda S. Two hundred dollars
Item 5th I give and devise to the kin of my beloved son William Vazey Two hundred dollars
Item 6th I give and devise to my beloved daughter Winifred A. Harlan Two hundred dollars
Item 7th I give and devise to my beloved daughter Milha Two hundred dollars
Item 8th I give and devise to my beloved son Wesley S. Vazey half of lot number
24 in the 10th district in Carroll County Ga and Fifty dollars
Item 9th I give and devise to my beloved daughter Virginia Two hundred dollars
Item 10th All of the above sums I wish to be paid out of the money
that I have out at Interest
Item 11th The rest of my property both real and personal Wherever and whatever
I give unto my beloved wife Batharine Vazey to have and to hold
as long as she remains a widow should she marry I wish an
Equal division of the said property to be made between her and
my three youngest children to wit Harriet Martha and Calist
Vazey. And if she remains a widow until her death I wish
all the above property I have given her to be equally divided between the
three named children to wit Harriet, Martha & Calist Vazey
Item 12th I do by these presents constitute and appoint my friend
Alexander Colclough Executor of this my last will and Testament
hoping and believing he will carry out the same to the true meaning
and intent of the same. I do therefore hereunto set my hand and seal
this the 22^d day of May 1867.
