Threshing machine purchased & Kitchen furniture, to have & to use
during her natural life or widowhood as she may deem proper
for the best interest of the family.

Item 3. At the death of my wife the above mentioned property to be
much thereof as may be remaining, left to her in that manner
that will be most to the interest of all & convenient to distribute as
follows

1st To my son George Washington One hundred dollars.

2nd. To my son William Martin - One hundred dollars

3^d To my Son Thos, Wesley One hundred dollars

4th To my daughter Margaret Hammon One hundred dollars

5th To my daughter Sarah Ann One hundred dollars.

Item 4. Should there be any surplus, after making the above
bequests. The same to be divided equally among all my
children to wit - Joseph, Elijah, Nancy, Caroline, Sophia, Elizabeth
Mary Ann, Pleasant, Susanna, Anna & Lydia Anne, or their
trueful heirs, together with those above named, which will make
all equal, so I have given any older children the hundred
dollars each.

Item 5. I hereby appoint my son Joseph & my wife Ruth, Executrix of
this my last Will & Testament. In testifying whereof I have written
at my hands & affixed my seal this 4th day of May 1873, in presence of the
undersigned Testators -
