ory, and considering the uncertainty of this frail
and transitory life, do therefore, make, ordain, publish
and declare this to be my last will and testament: that
is to say first after my funeral expenses and paid all
other of my lawful debts, are paid and discharged, the
residue of my estate, real and personal, I give and be-
queath as follows, to wit: To Patsy Ellen Davis to have the
hundred acres of land in Carroll County Georgia
belong her and her ~~body~~ heirs, and she binding her-
self to take care and to provide food and raiment
for her mother during her natural life. Elizabeth
Abnerman, wife of Wm H. Abnerman. Mary E.
Pate wife of Samuel Pate, who resides in Cibola
County Ala. and Martha Jane Moultry, wife of
Young Moultry, who has removed to North Ala. Susan
H. Knight, wife of J. H. Knight of J. H. County Ala.
and Charles A. Johnson of J. H. County Alabama.

are my lawful heirs, at my death. I desire that at
my decease my property be sold on twelve months to
the effect of which is to be collected together with the cash
on hand and collection of all solvent notes to be
equally divided between the above named heirs, and
their children with the following exceptions to wit: My
son Charles A. Johnson has had a full distribution
share of my estate and in justice to the other heirs
is to have no more. Also Piers E. Davis to have
nothing more only the land mentioned and the
two oldest children of my daughter Mary & Kate is not to have
anything of my effects, but only to her and her three younger
children to have a full share of the estate. Likewise I make
constitute and appoint my son Charles A. Johnson to be
Executor of this my last will and testament hereby re-
voking all former wills by me made— Last of all bequeathing
my soul to God who gave it— Amen— This December the 25th 1878
