

Letter Sealed William Ward of the State and County
Court County I consider a Farmer by occupation being of advanced
age and knowing that he long I must dispose
of his life claim & right had proper both no respects myself and
family treat & should make a disposition of the property
which a divine Providence has blessed me do therefore
and hereby make this my last will whereby I give devise and
bequeath all my Estate both Personal and Real
Item 1st I do desire and direct that my body be buried in a
decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circum-
stances and condition in life.

Item 2nd I desire and direct that all my just debts be
paid after my dissolution before any distribution of

my property
Item 3rd I desire that the payment of my debts
officers be done out of my Estate by my Executor
hereafter appointed and that he distribute the
remainder of my Estate as herein after directed
Item 4th I give devise and bequeath to my beloved
wife Elizabeth Ward all of my Estate both Real and
Personal to her I may be seized and possessed of
at my death to repair and use for and during her
natural life only
Item 5th It is further expressly understood that upon
the death of my said wife the abovethat I give devise
and bequeath the rest of my son - children to
William Ward Mary Jane Haway Amelia Yarrow
Nathaniel Ward Edward Ward and Nathaniel the residue
of my Estate both Real and personal By my
last will with him and personal
last will he shall be sold by my Executor herein
after appointed and the proceeds of such sale to be given
divided by said Executor between said four named children
Item 6th Whereas it is true that one of my children
opposed to my son was Ward aforementioned leaving
Guardian under his control the Estate of his son
Child in to his Sarah & Camp - do I command Ward
Ade Howland Ward Martha Alice Ward to be divided as
has been hereditary bound up and settled as
such a number land "woman" Ward to be divided

and whoe whol shal have Securty therefor it is
hereby distinctly and expressly understood that the said a
foresaid Ward is to have no part of my estate before given
devised and bequeathed until he has made a final and
legitimate settlement of the estate of his said children
whereby none of my estate herein before given devised
and bequeathed during my life nor after my death may
be liable or inumbered in the event of a breach of his
bond upon the part of the said Thomas J. Ward or any other
definite miscarriage of the said Thomas J. Ward, but then
the said Thomas J. Ward make a final and legitimate
settlement of his said childrens estate and thereby release
me and all my estate before given devised and bequeathed
from all liability in consequence of said bond then
and in that event my Executor hereinafter appointed
so hereby authorized and required to deliver to the said
Thomas J. Ward his Pro Rata share of any estate
aforenall to wit an equal portion with my other three
children aforesaid.

Item 7th I hereby constitute and appoint my son
in law, Moses E. Brown Executor of this my last
will and testament. In testimony whereof I have
signed sealed published and declared this instrument
my last will at my residence in said County
this the sixth day of January A.D. 1881.
