State of Georgia In the Name of God Amen I Jesse Woodard of
 Small County said State and being of sound and disposing
 mind and disposing mind and memory
 Knowing that I cannot Shortly defend this life I am of proper
 and right both as respects my Family and myself that I should
 make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence
 has blessed me. I do therefore make this my last Will and
 Testament hereby revoking and annulling all others here to fore
 made by me.

I do hereby declare and direct that my body be buried in a decent
 and Christianlike manner suitable to my Circumstances and
 condition in life my soul I trust shall return to rest
 with God who gave it and I hope for Salvation through the
 merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour
 Jesus Christ

I do hereby declare and direct that all my just debts be paid without
 delay by my Executor hereinafter named and appointed

I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved wife
 Elizabeth Woodard a part of Lot of land No 578 in the tenth
 District of Small County containing one hundred and eighty
 three acres or less with all the right and appurtenances to and
 lot or parcel of land in any wise belonging free from all
 charges of encumbrance whatever to her own proper use kept
 and being given with all some to the use of the same by
 Will or otherwise as he may deem proper during her natural
 life or widowhood and also I give in the same husbanded
 manner all my moving personal together with all my
 household and kitchen furniture I also direct that my
 son William Woodard have a certain main part some twenty
 or there abouts one year old now at this time I also direct that
 that Jerry W. Woodard my next son have a lot at the
 same value as fifty dollars in money in ten parts and John L.
 Woodard all have the same as the two first mentioned at
 25 years old and I also further direct that my daughter
 Fannie Woodard have one cow and pig and a good

hens, pig and had clothing with it and I also direct that
 Annanah Woodard have the same amount as her sister the above
 named Elizabeth have and Phoebe Woodard and Mary Woodard
