family that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind
providence has blessed, I therefore make this my last Will and Testament finally
revoking and annulling all others heretofore made by me
Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christianlike
manner. My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope for eternal
salvation through the blessed Lord and savior Jesus Christ. Whose Religion I have professed
as it as I humbly trust enjoyed for many years
Item 2nd I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my
Executor herein after named as I am committing my creditors should be delayed of
their rights Especially as there is no necessity for delay
Item 3rd I give and devise to my beloved wife Susan with whom I have lived
in the strictest quiet and love for many years, two lots of land number one
hundred and ninety five and two hundred and thirty two in the Eleventh District
of Canoll containing four hundred and six acres about twenty of which is cleared
and in cultivation with all the rights members and appurtenances to said lots of lands
in any way belonging free from charge or limitation whatever to her own proper
during her widowhood, but after my decease if she should marry again then
and in that case to be an equal heir with my present children of her body living
after the present date I also give and bequeath to my Wife in the same
manner the farming utensils and stock of all kinds, Corn and fodder Household
and kitchen furniture to her own proper use for the purpose of raising and educating
our children. Item 4th I make and appoint my Father John R Wood
Executor to this my last Will and Testament this 12th May 1860. Thos A Wood
