to provide for her during the latter period of
life and after paying off all my just debts
I do will and bequeath unto her all the
property that I own or possess of every kind
or sort during her natural life and to be
a homestead for Kenneth E. and Martha E.
Wyatt during their unmarried life and then
to be divided equally between my four daugh-
ters namely L. R. Dal, S. J. Luchey, Kenneth
E. Martha E. Wyatt. The foregoing constitutes
my last will or wish in substance. In
