same to be raised out of my estate by my
executors in such manner as he may deem best.

All the residue of my estate, consisting of the
following described lands: Lots of Land No:
Twenty Five (25), Montgomery (25), North East (25),
North West (25), and the south half of lot
Twenty Seven (27) all being in the Parish of
(11) Dist. of said County of Carroll, with
my household and kitchen furniture - one
brown leather sofa of silvery ware, my stock
cattle, hogs, hays, and of my

estate and such mineral interests as I then
reserved in the lands heretofore sold by me,
and which will appear from the deeds which
I have made - together with all other
property owned by me, I give, bequeath
and devise to my son George. B. Bonner
