I David S. Anderson of said County being of advanced age, and knowing that it is appointed unto all men to die, do make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me heretofore made.

Item I desire that my body shall be buried in a plain decent manner - I entertain a firm hope that my soul shall be saved through the merits of the Attonement of the Lord and divine grace which in whom I put my trust.

Item If at the time of my death I should owe any money, I desire that the same shall be paid as soon as my executors can conveniently pay the same, but as I do not now owe any debt or at least if I owe any they are very small and as I do not expect to contract any this provision is not to be construed as admitting any debts.

Item It is my will and desire that all the property I may own at the time of my death - including both real and personal property wherever the same may be situated shall be divided into four equal parts of which my son David S. Anderson shall have one part, my son James H. Anderson shall have one part, the ^{three} children of my deceased daughter Virginia Camp shall have one part, and the remaining share shall to and vest in my son James H. Anderson as trustee subject to the terms of the next item in this will.

Item The share of my estate I wish to give to my son James H. Anderson as trustee is to be held by him in trust for the use and benefit of my son David S. Anderson and his family. The herein stated said property shall not be subject in any manner to the contracts, debts or liabilities of my son D. S. Anderson, but the same to the family shall

best in my said son J. H. Anderson
who shall use, dispose of or invest the
same just as he thinks best for the purpose
of providing for the welfare and comfort of
my said son D. C. Anderson and his family.
I make this disposition of this part of my
estate because I believe it is best for the
persons to be benefited that it should be so
disposed of, and not because of any want
of affection for my said son D. C. Anderson.
I want to be understood as giving to my son
J. H. and his heirs the power to sell my prop-
erty, both real and personal, at such times
and on such terms, as they think best for
all concerned, and if they think it best to
sell the same or any
part of it at private sale, they shall be
authorized as to sell it and in the man-
ner of my estate, I give them power to
do whatever they think best and advantage
