to be my last Will and Testament, That is to say
First after paying lawful debts are paid
and discharged, the residue of my estate real and
personal of which I am now possessed I give be-
queath and dispose of to my wife Edith and
for to hold and enjoy all the right and after death
survive themselves and their heirs and assigns forever

law and furthermore it is my desire that my wife shall have the power to sell any of my property either real or personal that is necessary for the maintenance of any of my minor children. After my youngest child shall have arrived at full age I desire that my wife still hold and retain the possession of my present Homestead in her own right with all the rights and privileges allowed her by law in case she is living. And at the death of my wife it is my desire that all my property both real and personal shall be equally divided (and "justly" before divided) among all my children and heirs then living share and share alike.

Witness my hand and seal this 14th day of January 1880. I, James Campbell and my wife to be executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal the fourteenth day of January in the year One thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty 1880.
