 This is the last will and Testament of me & Ann
 Parker, widow, residing on my Plantation, on
 the Effe of Hope in the State of Georgia; after
 paying my funeral charges and discharging
 my lawfull debts, I dispose of my estate in
 manner and form following, that is to say,
 I give devise and bequeath unto my said
 Daughters Grace Harley / wife of John
 Harley, esq.^r / and Susannah Koss / wife of
 Thomas Koss esq.^r / all and singular my
 Negro Slaves named old Isaac, John
 (his wife) Bob, Peter, Young, Leonard,
 Isaac, Leander, Toney, Sam and Polly;
 the sons and daughter of old Leonard and
 Chloe; To have and to hold, to said
 Negroes above named, with their
 issue, of their issue and increase, unto
 my said Daughters Grace Harley and
 Susannah Koss their heirs and each of
 their heirs and assigns for ever, to be
 divided by and between my said Daugh-
 ters immediately after my decease, in
 such way and manner, as they my
 said Daughters, shall think proper, and
 without being subject to the power or
 controul of their present, or any future
 husbands

21 husbands, or any other person or persons whatever -
and so that such estate hereby given and bequeathed
be to them, and each of them, and as of their, and
each of their separate estate, for and notwithstanding
-ing, their present, or any future coverture. -
I give devise and bequeath unto my Grand-
children Ann Harby, / daughter of Samuel -
and Grace Harby, / Ann Robt, Isabella Robt,
and Thomas Robt / daughters and Son of
Thomas and Susannah Robt / and to -
their and each of their heirs and assigns
for ever, as soon as the Youngest of my
Grandchildren above named shall attain
the Age of twenty one years: with that plan-
tation & tract of Land, whereon I now reside
situate on the North end of the Isle of St. John,
in the State of Jamaica, containing five -
hundred Acres / more or less / and also all mes-
sages, buildings, and improvements, then
and thereto belonging; And also all
those negro Slaves named, old Tom, Overseer,
Jack, old Printer, bats Dick, Young Printer,
Jacob, Young Tom, Clarinda and Maria,
To have and to hold the said plantation
or tract of Land containing five hundred
Acres (more or less) with the buildings, and
appurtenances, thereto belonging, together
with the said seven negro Slaves, last herein
before mentioned, with their and many of
their future issue and increase unto my said
Grand

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Grandchildren, Ann Parley, Ann Koss
Isabella Koss and Thomas Koss, and to their heirs
each of them heirs and assigns for ever as Tenants
in common, so soon as the youngest of my
said Grandchildren, shall arrive to the age of
twenty-one years, and not before. And it is
my will and express direction, that the land
and bequestes herein devised and bequeathed
to my said Grandchildren be kept together and
improved, by and at the immediate direction
of my executor herein after named with-
out the intervention or trouble of any person
whatsoever until the attainment of the age
of twenty-one years of my youngest Grand-
child, at which time a division of their
estate is to take place: All the rest and
residue of my estate real and personal, I
give devise and bequeath, to my said Grand-
Children above named, on the same terms
and under the same Restrictions, as the
land and bequestes above mentioned are
subject to. And I hereby nominate and
appoint my son James Parker, now
residing with me, Executor of this my last
will and Testament, hereby appointing
an Farmer wife and wife by me heretofore
made. In witness whereof I the said
Ann Parker, have hereunto set my hand and
Seal, at and for my County and Testament

written on one sheet of paper, this twenty ninth day of August, in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty three.

Signed, sealed, published and declared by the above named Ann Parker as and for her last Will and Testament in the presence of us, who have hereto subscribed our names as witnesses thereto, in the presence of the said Testatrix, and in presence of each other.
