

Georgia In the Name of God, Amen

I Andrew Etton Mills of Savannah in the province
of Georgia being of sound Mind and Memory, &c
Knowing that all men once must die, Do make
this my last Will and Testament in manner and
form as follows

Imprimis I will that my body may be buried in a decent
Christian-like manner, committing my Body to
the earth, there wait for the glorious Resurrection
in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Item, That all my Funeral charges be first paid.

Item, That all my Just debts be paid, In such, &c
manner as my wife, Jane Mills and my Executors
may think most for the advantage of my said
Beloved Wife and Children.

Item, That after all Debts are paid and discharged,
an equal dividend be made (particularly I do
Injoin, said Dividend be made before my Wife
may marry) of lands, Houses, and real Estate,
as well as personal Shares & Shares alike, not
more to a male than a female; and this is
my present as well as future Intention, That
whatever my Child or Children may be &c
lawfully born of my Dr. Beloved Wife Jane
Wells Subsequent to the Signing & Sealing
of this Instrument That, that Child or Children

to be divided, to its, or their, equal, proportion
or Dividend, as above recited, and, that the
Substance of this Item, may be taken for what
Lands &c I may acquire any time, between this
day and that of my Death, and in order to be, &
more explicit I will, that my Dear Beloved
Wife and every Surviving Child may have full
and Equal Shares of Fortune.

Item: "In the Disposal of Lands (Tho left to the discre-
tion of my Executors) I would recommend to them to
dispose of the Distillery first.

Lastly I nominate and appoint James Maxwell and
John Sandiford my dear beloved Brothers In Law
my Executors, & my dear Beloved Wife Jane Wells
my Executrix, and that I declare this to
be my last will, and Testament, revoking all
Others

January 7th 1776 in the presence
