I Ann Barbara Rabenhorst, of the Parish of St. Mat-  
thew in the Province of Georgia, make herewith my last  
will & Testament, with good Judgement and full un-  
derstanding, how my Property shall be disposed of after  
my Death.

In the First place, I recommend my Soul into the  
Hands of my beloved heavenly Father, and my Body un-  
to the Earth, that the same may be buried in the Bu-  
rying Ground of Zion, in the Place where my Dear  
Husband and Child lie buried, where our beloved  
Saviour will let us rest together untill that Day  
when he shall awake us with all his Faithfull, and  
lead us into the Life of eternal Bliss. Amen!

Secondly, all just Debts shall be duly settled -  
and paid.

Thirdly, I bequeath forty pounds to the Orphan  
house at Halle, and also forty pounds to the East-  
indies, which ought likewise to be delivered at Halle  
in Germany and be employed according to the Dis-  
cretion of the Directors of said House.

Fourthly, my Dear sister Maria Rosina Krafft  
living at Ravensburg a free imperial City in Swa-  
bia, shall draw one Half of all that is left; the  
three hundred and ten Pounds, which she has al-  
ready received, shall belong to the whole Inheri-  
tance; the other Half shall belong to the Heirs of  
my three Sisters - *Ann, Mary Hoppe in Daber,*

and Sophy Neumann in Berlin, and Christina,  
This Half shall be divided into three equal Parts  
and each of them shall draw one share.

Likewise the Negroe Family (s) shall be apprais-  
ed at a reasonable Rate and left to Joseph Schub-  
trein, of which he shall have the Negroe Girl called  
Hagar as a Present. As to what concerns the ap-  
praising and selling, I leave that to both my -  
dear Executors, as they shall think best, to whom no-  
body, let him be who he will, shall have anything  
to object; and I choose for my Executors my two dear  
Friends Mr. Joseph Schubtrein and Mr. Jacob Cas-  
par Waldhauer. And that this is my last will  
and Testament made with good Understanding  
I do witness with my own Hand, Signature &  
Seal, the thirtieth day of June, one thousand,  
seven hundred, seventy nine.
