

This is the last Will and Testament of me Archibald
Pullock of the parish of Christ Church in the province of
Georgia Esquire being in good health of Body and of sound
and disposing mind and memory duly considering that
it is appointed for all men once to die, and being mindful of
the uncertainty of that great change when it shall please
God to call me hence do make this my last Will Testament
of and concerning the real and personal Estates wherof I am
in anywise seized or possessed of either present or
reversion or remainder or any other person in trust for
me or which I have any power to dispose of as followeth.
First, I give and devise to all my sons that may be
living at the time of my death all my Lands and other
real Estate whatsoever or wheresoever, and of what nature
or kind soever, equally to be divided amongst them, share
and share alike if more than one to hold to them their heirs
and assigns for ever, provided always, and it is my Will
my eldest son shall have the first choice of his share or
portion after the same is divided. And I give
and devise bequeath to my dear Wife Mary Pullock, all my
Furniture, Goods, Household stuff, utensils & implements
whatsoever in a belonging to my dwelling house or dwelling
houses whatsoever at the time of my death. And I give
and bequeath to my said dear Wife and to all my children
that may be alive at the time of my death, all the rest and
residue of my personal Estate to be equally divided
between them share and share alike, but it is my Will
and I do hereby give my said dear Wife full power to name
any four of my Negroes to be included in her share or portion
the respective share of each Child or children to be respectively
distributed

delivered to her upon their obtaining their ages of twenty one
years or days of Marriage which shall first happen, AND
it is my further Will that the proceeds of my said Estate, after
the maintenance of my said Wife and Children is deducted be
laid out in purchasing Lands or Negroes or both as my
Executors herein after mentioned shall think fit and most for
the benefit of my Estate. But I do order and direct, and it is my
Will that no part of my Estate be sold. — And I do
hereby nominate and appoint my said dear Wife Mary, ~~xxxxxx~~
Executrix, and my Friends James Deane and Joseph Clay,
Esquires and my dear son James to be Executors of this my Will
But it is my will, and I do hereby order and direct my said
Executors not to interrupt my said Wife in the management
of my Estate and education of my Children so long as she
continues my widow, —

But my further Will is and I do
hereby direct that in case my said Wife after my death shall happen
to marry with any other husband, that and in such case, that
they my Executors shall take upon themselves the management
of my Estate, that my said Wife's share or portion of the same
be immediately delivered to her, and Executrix ship cease and
determine. And I do hereby revoke and make void all
former Wills and Testaments. In Witness whereof I the
said Archibald Bullock have to this my last Will & Testament —
contained in two sheets of paper fixed together in the margin
and sealed, and to the last sheet have set my Hand & Seal, and to
the other sheet my Hand only, declaring it to be my last Will &
Testament this eleventh day of February in the year of our
Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy five —
and in the fifteenth year of the Reign of his Majesty
King
