

At the same time Thomas Gibbons Junr. and William Fox two of the Executors named in the said Last Will, qualified as such, by taking the Oath prescribed by Law.

GIVEN under my Hand this 14th
Day of January 1798

This is the last Will and Testament of me Charles Pryce the Younger of Savannah in the State of Georgia in North America, which I do now make being of sound and perfect Mind Memory and Understanding, that is to say, I do with all Humility resign myself into the Hands of Almighty God the kind Disposer of all human Events, earnestly hoping for the Guidance of his good Providence through all my Understandings in life, and firmly relying on his paternal Aid and Support in the awful Hours of Death. I do direct that all my just Debts and Funeral Expenses be paid by my Executors hereafter named as soon as conveniently may be after my Decease. I then I give devise and bequeath to William Stephens of Savannah aforesaid Esquire and William O'Bryen of the same place Esquire the Sum of Fifty Pounds lawful Money of the said State over and above such Sum or Sums of Money as shall be reasonable for their care Trouble and Expenses in the Discharge of the Office hereby reposed in them. And after Payment of such my lawful Debts and the Legacies hereby given to the said William Stephens and William O'Bryen. Then I do give devise and bequeath to my most beloved Father Charles Pryce lately residing at

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Parsons Green in the Parish of Fulham in the County
of Middlesex Leguise All and singular my Lands, Lots,
Tenements Hereditaments and Appurtenances Negroe
Slaves, Goods Chattels, Personal Estate Outstanding Debts
and other my Property both Real and Personal situate lying
and being in the said State of Georgia or elsewhere To
hold to him his Heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns
for ever without any other Trust Limitation or Provision
whatsoever of or concerning the same And in case of
the Death of my said Father before this my Will may by
the operation of the Law take Effect then I do give devise and
bequeath the same and every part thereof in the like full
and ample manner to all Intents and Purposes to my
dear and much loved Aunt Mary Jaguer late residing
at Parsons Green aforesaid To hold to her, her Heirs -
Executors Administrators and Assigns, And in case
of the Death of both my said Father and Aunt before
this my Will might take Effect then I do give and devise
the same Lands Lots Tenements and Hereditaments
Negroe Slaves and other Property before mentioned to such
Person and Persons as under the last Will and Testament
of my said Father shall be intitled to the Remainder of
his Estate Or in case this my last mentioned bequest
cannot operate then to such Person or Persons as in a
due course of the Law of England shall be intitled to the
Distribution of my said Fathers Personal Estate And
I do nominate constitute and Appoint the said William
Stephens and William Morgan together with my said
Father Executors of this my Will, revoking all former
and other Will or Wills by me at any time heretofore made
and declaring this to be my last Will and Testament
In Witness whereof I have to this my Will contained in this
and the preceding Title of Paper set my Hand and
Seal at Savannah aforesaid the Twentyfourth Day
of November in the Year of Our Lord One thousand

Seven hundred and seventy Eight.
