*In primis* I commend my Immortal Soul into the hands of Almighty God, who gave it, & my Body to the Earth from whence it came, (in Hopes of a Joyfull Resurrection, through the Merite of my Saviour Jesus Christ, to be buried in a Christian and decent like manner at the direction of my Executors. ~

And as for that worldly Estate wherewith it has been pleased God to bless me with I dispose in manner & Form following, Viz<sup>o</sup>.

*In primis* I desire that all my Just & Lawfull Debts may be paid. I Give and bequeath to my dear and beloved Brother Joel Walker the Sum of Five Pounds Sterling Money of Great Britain. ~

*Item*, I Give and bequeath to my Dear and beloved Nephew Joel Walker all that Tract or Parcell of Land, situated on Tombigby River at the first Falls known by the of the Horse Shoe Neck, containing Five hundred Acres; Likewise all that Tract or Parcell of Land, Joining the above mentioned Tract, on the Westnorthwest, containing one hundred Acres. ~ ALSO, all

that Tract or Parcel of Land on the Tombigby  
 River, at the Entrance of the Creek called xx  
 Pall Biow, Containing Two Thousand Acres; -  
 Likewise Fourteen Negroes, Named, Tom, Ned,  
~~Sam~~, Pompey, Titus, Charles Stephen, Aaron,  
 Antony, Sam, Nell, Darcus, Jenney, Salley,  
 & Tully. - Likewise all my Stocks of Cattle  
 Horses & Hogs &c.

And Lastly, I DO hereby make,  
 Constitute, & Ordain my Dearly Beloved &  
 most Kind Friend Mr. Peter Swanson, and  
 my beloved Nephew Joel Walker, to be my x  
 Lawfull Executors, of this my last Will & xx  
 Testament, And it is my last Will, that,  
 none of my Negroes or Effects shall be Sold, -  
 But That my Debts shall be paid with what, x  
 what Staves & other Produce I have on hand &  
 what may be made by the Negroes, I desire that  
 my Nephew Joel Walker, may Receive & poss  
 & keep them for his own Use. In Witness  
 whereof I have hereunto Sett my Hand  
 & Seal this Twentysixth Day of December:  
 in the year of our Lord one thousand  
 Seven hundred & Seventy Nine. ~ ~ ~
