hundred Acres. more or less and in the County afo-
said - shall be in the possession of my Dear Husband
Thomas Stone to use as he thinks best, during
his natural life, and at his death to become the
property of my God Daughter Elizabeth Butler
Maxwell, to her and the heirs of her body forever.
Item, I give & bequeath to my Daughter in
law Susannah Stuart the negroe Women named
Nanny particularly named to me in the Will
of my late Husband James Stuart of the State

aforesaid and County of Liberty to be & remain
her property till she becomes of Age, or married.
Then the said negroe woman Nanny to have
her freedom in every sence and meaning of
the word, the remainder of her life - It is my
Will and desire that the negroes I was to receive
at the division of the Estate of my late husband
James Stuart, as aforesaid. shall return and, be
equally divided, share and share alike amongst
the Heirs of said Estate. - I do hereby give & bequeath
of my late Husband as aforesaid to my Daughter ^{only named to me in the Will} Ruthy Jones the
Horse & Chair particulerly named to me in the Will
- I now make constitute and ap-
point my beloved husband Thomas Stone, my wor-
thy Friends George Walton, and William Maxwell
Esquires to be my Executors to this my last Will and
Testament. _____
