

In the name of God, Amen, I Frederick Rolfes of Savannah in the County of Chatham being weak in body but of sound and disposing memory blessed be God, do this thirteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty three make this my last Will and testament in manner and form following, I will my body to be buried in such decent manner as my Executor hereafter named shall judge proper, and after payment of my just debts and funeral expences, the following disposition of such real and personal Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with shall take place -

First. If my lands in the province of East Florida which have been sold and disposed of under the British Government since my departure from the said province can be recovered, I give and devise them or such quantity or parcels of the same as me be so recovered I give and devise to the boy known and called by the name of William George Rolfes, To the girl known and called by the name of Theresa Rolfes and to the girl called and known by the name of Elizabeth Anne Rolfes my three natural children, to be divided between the aforesaid three children with an Estate of fee simple to each.

Secondly. I give and bequeath unto my three natural children as aforesaid, to wit, to the boy

called and known by the name of ^{Chatham Co. Will Bk B 1788-1791} ~~William~~ George Rolfe, to the girl called and known by the name of Theresa Rolfe, and to the girl called and known by the name of Elizabeth Anne Rolfe the whole of my personal Estate to be divided in three equal parts, in like manner with my real Estate, between them —

Lastly — I do constitute and appoint Joseph Woodruff Esquire of Savannah sole Executor of this my last will and testament whereunto I have set my hand and seal the day and year first above written
