Do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament
hereby Revoking all former Wills by me made.

In Primis I give my Soul into the hand of my blessed
Redeemer whom I hope to meet with full Arms, on the great
and trying Day of Judgment when I hope it will meet with
that Justice Due to its Demerits. My Body I desire may be
Interred in a Decent manner without Pomp or Noise
as for my Worldly Goods I give and Bequeath them in the
manner Following.

Imprimis I Give Devise and Bequeath unto my Daughter
Jane Judith Papot a Town Lot No: four with all its appurtenan-
ces. Which is situated on the Bay of the Town of Savannah
to her, her Heirs and Assigns for Ever, and in Case the said
Jane Papot should Die without heirs of her Natural Body
that then the said lot with its appurtenances be equally
Divided between Jane Judith Bourquin Senr. Benedict
Bourquin and Judith Bourquin, and when my Nephew Peter
Papot arrives to the age of twenty one years they shall
pay him twenty five Pounds Sterling; and my Nephew John
Wedderell Twenty five Pounds, and my Nephew Isaac Wedderell
Twenty five Pounds each at the age of Twenty one years.
My Will & Desire is that all my Furniture be sold to defray
the expences accrued on my late Illness, as also Fifty acres
of land, in Case the said Furniture should not be equivalent
for the Purpose of paying of my Debts, that then the above
land be sold for that purpose. the Remaining part of my
Estate of what Condition or Quality soever I give and
bequeath to my Daughter Jane Papot, I do also appoint my
said Daughter Jane Papot Executrix of Benedict Bourquin
Executor and James Galashier Executor of this my last Will
& Testament in Witness whereof I have put my hand and
affirmed my seal this third Day of January one thousand seven
hundred and eighty four.
