

Georgia In the Name of God amen

Chatham Co. Will Bk B 1784-1785
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John Anderson of the Town of Savannah Gentleman being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind, memory and understanding thanks be given unto God calling unto mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament That is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my Body to the earth to be buried in a plain and decent manner at the discretion of my Executors herein after named nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in manner and form following That is to say It is my Will and desire that my funeral Expences and all other my lawful debts be paid as soon as conveniently may be after my decease

Item I give devise and bequeath a certain Town Lot of land in the Town of Savannah known in the plan of the said Town by the number Ten in the third Wything Reynolds Ward containing Sixty feet in front and ninety feet in depth be the same more or less unto my dear and blessed Mother Elizabeth Anderson her Heirs and Assigns absolutely and for ever.

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my said Mother Elizabeth Anderson all that Tract or

parcel of land containing One hundred and fifty Acres (more or less) situate lying and being in the parish of Saint George in the State aforesaid bounded to the North East by a Tract herein after mentioned and on all other sides by lands Vacant at the time of the original Survey thereof to her and her Heirs for ever

Item I give devise and bequeath All that other Tract or parcel of Land containing One hundred and fifty Acres (be the same more or less) situate and being in the said Parish of Saint George and bounded to the South West by the aforesaid Tract of land and on all other sides by lands Vacant at the time of the original Survey thereof unto my said Mother Elizabeth Anderson her Heirs and Assigns absolutely and for ever

Item I give devise and bequeath all and whatsoever other Estate real or personal that I may be possessed of or entitled unto at the time of my decease and not herein before mentioned unto the said Elizabeth Anderson her Heirs and Assigns absolutely and forever — And lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my said Mother Elizabeth Anderson sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Will and Wills by me made In Witness whereof I the said John Anderson have hereunto set my Hand and Seal at Savannah this Eleventh day of September in the year of our Lord 1783

and understanding, and further that he the
said John Poullin with Andrew Johnston —
and James Whitefield Junr. subscribed their
names as Witnesses to the said Will at the

request and in the presence of the said Testator and
 in each others presence.
