I John McIntosh of St. Andrews Parish and Province of Georgia Planter, being in perfect health and soundness of mind and memory Thanks be to God; but being under a necessity of being absent from the said Parish some Time; therefore calling to Mind the mortality of my Body, and knowing that it is appointed for all Men to Die, Do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament; that is to say, Principally and first of all, I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of almighty God that give it and my Body I recommend to the Earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but

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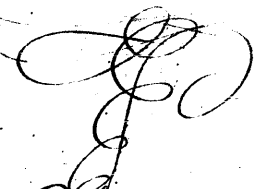
but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again,
by the mighty Power of God, and as Touching such worldly Estate
wherein it has pleased God to Bless me in this life, I give
Devise and Dispose of the same in the following manner and
form. —

First, I give and Bequeath to M^{rs} Winewood Nobles my
Dearly and well beloved Cousen, The sum of one hundred and
Ten Pounds of lawful money of great Britain; as all and every
thing or things Part or parts of my Estate, good, Debts, and
moveables or Effects whatsoever, and she the said Winewood
Noble I likewise constitute make and ordain my Sole
Exectric of this my last Will and Testament, all and singular
of my Estate, by her freely to be possessed and enjoyed, and I
have also given her a Power of Attorney, which Power I also
Bequeath to the said Winewood Nobles as a legacy bearing
Date only with this my last Will and Testament and to expire
when it is revoked, and I do hereby utterly disallow Revoked
and Disannul ~~and~~ all and every other former Testaments, Wills,
Legacies Bequests and Exectrics, by me in any waye Before
Named Willed and Bequeathed, Ratifying and confirming this, and
no other, to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof,

Georgia Planter (for Divers Considerations and good Causes me
hereunto moving) have made ordained constituted and
appointed, and by these Presents, Do make ordain constitute and
appoint my trusty friend M^{rs} Winewood Nobles of the Parish and
Province of Georgia my True and lawful Attorney for
me and in my Name, and to my use, to ask, Demand, Recover

or Receive, of and from Mr. George Houston Robert Baillie and Patrick Houston Joint Executors of the Estate of George McIntosh of the above Parish and Province Deceased, The sum of one hundred and ten Pounds Sterling, giving and by these Presents granting to my said Attorney, my Sole and full Power and authority to Take pursue and follow such legal Courses, for the Recovery Receiving and obtaining of the same, as I my self might or could Do, were I personally Present, and upon the receipt of the same, Acquittances and other sufficient discharges for me, and in my Name, to make sign seal and Deliver, as also one more Attorney or Attorneys under her to substitute or appoint, and again at her pleasure to revoke and further to Do, Perform, and finish for me, and in my Name all and singular thing or things, which shall or may be necessary, Touching and Concerning the Premises, as fully Thoroughly and Intirely, as I the said John McIntosh in my own person, ought or could do in and about the same, Ratifying allowing and confirming whatever my said Attorney shall lawfully Do, or cause to be done in and about the execution of the Premises, by Virtue of these Presents: And that my said Attorney is by the above authority in her vested, fully empowered to Transact all and every such like business in my Name and Speed as above, in Witness whereof I have herunto set my hand and Seal the twenty second day of July, in the twenty first year of our Sovereign Lord George the third, By the Grace of God, King of Great Britain &c. &c. and in the year of our Lord God 1781—
