Item,

I give devise & bequeath, unto my dear Mother Jane Nelson, & unto my beloved Brother William Nelson their Heirs & assigns one hundred pounds Sterling Money of Great Britain, now lying at Interest in Scotland with the Interest thereon due, Together with all such Monies as shall be due me in this State, after my Just debts and funeral Charges are paid to be equally divided & Between my said Mother Jane and Brother William their Heirs & assigns as soon after my Death as possible.

And I do hereby nominate and appoint William Watt & Alexander Cunningham my Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made. And it is my Will that my Executors herein named, do immediately after they or either of them, shall enter on the Execution of their Office, Sell and dispose

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of my wearing apparel, and the monies
arising therefrom, and the rents of the
Negroes & Lands aforesaid to be disposed
of in such a manner as my Executors shall
think for the Interest of the persons to &
which they are given and bequeathed. In
