satisfied, I give and bequeath all

whatsoever and whosoever and of
what nature and kind soever, save
and except my wearing apparel / unto
my Son Richard Barrow, and my
Daughter Mary Hatcher Barrow
their Heirs Executors Administrators

and assigns to be equally divided —
between them share and share alike as soon
as conveniently may be after my decease,
And in case any dispute should happen
in the division thereof, the same shall be
settled by two or more indifferent persons
to be chosen by my said Son and daughter
for that purpose, And as for and
concerning my wearing apparel I
give and bequeath the same unto my said
daughter Mary Hatcher Bannan, And
I do hereby nominate constitute, and appoint
my said Son executor, and my daughter
administratrix of this my last will and testa-
ment, hereby revoking all former wills
by me at any time heretofore made —
I do declare this to be my last will and
Testament In witness whereof I have written
set my hand and seal, the Tenth day of Feb-
ruary One thousand seven hundred and eighty
Six —
