

I Sir Patrick Houston Baronet do make my last Will and Testament in manner and form following I give and bequeath unto my ever affectionate dutiful and beloved Brother George Houston his heirs and assigns forever all the Lands, Negroes, bonds, notes goods and effects of every kind whereof I die possessed and that shall remain after the payment of my just debts and the legacies herein after mentioned. I give unto my Brother James five shillings I give unto my Brother John one hundred pounds I give unto my Brother William five hundred pounds The above sums to bear Interest at the expiration of six months after my decease and to be paid in twelve months after my death --- I give unto my Nephew John McIntosh one hundred pounds to bear interest from my death and to be paid to him when he arrives at the age of twenty one years, but if he should die before he arrives at that age then I direct that the said sum with the interest that may be due thereon be paid to the eldest surviving daughter of my Brother George and lastly I do hereby make and ordain my said Brother George sole Executor of this my last will and Testament
