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In the Name of God Amen, I Philip

Allman of the Town of Savannah, Carpenter being very sick and weak in body but of perfect Mind and Memory thanks be given unto God calling unto mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of all Mighty God that gave it And my Body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the Mighty Power of God - And as touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this Life I give demise and dispose of the same in the following Manner and form.

Imprimis it is my Will and desire that my Funerall expences and all other my lawfull Debts be paid as soon as possible out of my Stock in hand.

Item I give and bequeath to Ann Allman my dearly beloved Wife all my Household furniture consisting of four feather Beds, one Mahogany Bedstead one Mahogany Tea Table with all my other furniture as it now stands also three Horses and one Riding Chair during her natural life and if any of the above articles are in being after her Death then to my son Philip Allman and his Heirs.

Also

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Also I give and bequeath to Ann Allman my
beloved Wife one Negroe Girl named Minter for her
own and sole use during her natural life and after her
Death to go to my Son Philip Allman and his Heirs
with all her Children. It is also my Will that a Negroe
Man named Dick be sold to the best advantage and the
Money arising from the said sale be laid out in the
purchase of a Negroe Boy and Girl and the said to be
given to Ann Allman my Wife for her sole use till my
Son is of the Age of 21 twenty one years and then they
and their offspring to go to my Son Philip and his heirs.

Item I give to my Son Philip Allman and his Heirs
all my lands Consisting of four Hundred Acres of Land in
the parish of St. Philip forty five acre lott in the parish
of Christ Church also a five acre lott Joining the Common
of Savannah also a lott containing 120 one hundred and
twenty feet fronting Joining the said five Acres where a
Tomb now stands

Also I give and bequeath to my Son Philip and his
Heirs all my outstanding debts which when collected are
to be laid out for the use of my Son at the Discretion of
my Executors till he arrive at the Age of Twenty one.

Item I give to my Son Philip Allman and his Heirs
three Negroes Viz. one Man and two Women named Donn
Charlot and Phebee that run away at the time of the
Siege of Savannah in the year 1779 If ever they should
come in or be brought by force to Savannah. It is my
Will that my Executors dispose of them to the best
advantage for the use of my Son Philip Allman and
his

his Heirs Also one Gold Ring that did belong to my former Wife Jane Allman It is also my Will that the sum of (£360) three Hundred and sixty Pounds allowed me by Government (when received) for damages Sustained at the Siege of Savannah by the loss of my buildings being pulled down in the year 1779 be applied by my Executors towards Building a New House out Houses and other Conveniences where my former dwelling House stood Except the sum of (£60) Sixty of the above Sum which I give to the Sole use of my Executors as a Gratuity for their care and trouble

If the above Sum of (£360) three hundred and sixty Pounds be paid to my Executors before a peace takes place it is my Will that my Executors dispose of the above (£300) three hundred pounds to the best Advantage for the Benefit of my Son.

And I further Will that all my Carpenter tools and other Utensils which are unnecessary for the use of my Wife be sold and the money applied towards my funeral expences

And lastly it is my Will that if my Son should die without Heir ~~that~~ the whole that I have bequeathed to him shall go to the first lawfull Heir of Gattell Allman and if he should die before he come of Age then to be divided amongst the other Children and if there not any then after the death of their Mother to the Poor of the Parish.

And for the Due performance of this my above Will I do hereby appoint My beloved Wife Anne Allman Executrix and My friend Mr. William Ross Master of the Will

Merchant of Savannah My Executor. In Witness where-
of I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this twenty first
day of April in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
and Eighty One.
