Guinn planter of Chatham county in the State
of Georgia, labouring under sickness at pre-
sent, but having my understanding clear and
sound, think it necessary to dispose of all my
property in the following manner; that is to
say, It is my will that all my just debts be
paid as soon after my decease as conveni-
ent - Item, I give and bequeath unto my loving
wife Elizabeth Guinn the following negroes,
to wit, Bram and family, Peter and Saleby,
Rachel, Sam, Patty, Aleck and Betty, during the
life of my said wife, and unto her issue, and
in case my said wife dies before Rachel, then
Rachel to have her freedom; and I do hereby

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leave unto my loving wife aforesaid, all the Negroes that I got with her in marriage, to be at her own disposal. Item I leave all my furniture to my wife, except one bed and the furniture thereunto belonging. Item, it is my will that if my wife should die without issue, then that those negroes which I have bequeathed to her during her life, be disposed of as follows to wit that they shall be equally divided between my brother John's three sons, my brother George's daughter, and my sister Mary Wonderly's six children, each of the ten children aforesaid to possess an equal share. Item I give and bequeath unto my nephew John Quinn, the following seven negroes, Tom, Will, Simon, Chloe, March, Cork, & Luddy, and in case he should die without issue, then the above seven negroes to be equally divided between his two brother and his cousin Sarah Quinn.

Item, I leave the bed and furniture before mentioned to Miss Elizabeth Bonett, together with the three following negroes. Little Rachel, her son April, and a boy named Billy, to be her own property, and disposed of as she thinks proper. Item I leave three horses to my wife.

Item I order my cattle and my boats to be immediately sold, to assist in paying my debts. and lastly I appoint my wife executrix and my friend Thomas Mills executor of this my last will; and I do hereby annul and make void all wills made by me before

this date. in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this fifteenth day of Janu-
ary, in the year of our Lord one thousand, seven
hundred and eighty five.
