I Susannah Macfarlane, of Savannah, in the State of Georgia Widow, being sick and weak, but of sound disposing mind and memory, do make this my last Will and Testament; in manner and form Following, that is to say; After discharging my Funeral Expences, and faithful payment of my just debts, out of my Estate, by my Executors herein after named; I give devise and Bequeath unto my son Benjamin Wilson of Savannah Merchant, All those Negroe Slaves named, Coomba and her children Fatima and Pinah, Solomon, Sue and her children, Juns and Sarah, August, Bravaboy, Phillis, Harrington, Tonny, Betty, and Willit, To have and to hold the said several Negroe Slaves, herein before named, and the future issue and increase of the said Female Slaves, and every of them, unto my said son Benjamin Wilson, his heirs and Assigns for Ever as of his and their goods and chattels; I give, devise and bequeath unto my son John Macfarlane, all those my two or several Mesuages or Tenements, situated, in the parish of Christ Church in the Town of Savannah and State aforesaid, in a certain Street called Broughton's Street, together with all and singular the rights thereunto belonging, or in anywise appertaining, Also those Negroes named, Jack, Glasgow, Lightfoot, Lettice, and Juns to have and to hold the said several Negroe Slave herein

before named, and the future issue and increase
 of the said Female Slaves, and every of them unto
 my said son John Macfarlane, without any
 incumbrance; his heirs and assigns for ever as
 of his and thier goods and Chattels. I give,
 devise and Bequeath to my Grandson John
 Jamieson Jonston (Son of Mr. Thomas Jonston)
 The sum of Three hundred pounds, Sterling, now
 due and owing to me by Mr. James Thompson on
 a Bond, and a Judgement recovered thereon,
 which Bond and Judgement; I thereby Assign
 and set over unto my said Grandson, John
 Jamieson Jonston his heirs and assigns and
 all my Right as claim thereto, and the said
 Three hundred pounds with the Interest, due
 and to grow due, on the said Bond and Judg-
 ment, To hold the same and the monies due
 and to grow due as aforesaid, to the said John
 Jamieson Jonston his heirs and assigns for
 Ever; I also give and devise unto the said John
 Jamieson Jonston my Gold Watch to his heirs and
 assigns for Ever; I give devise and Bequeath unto
 my sons Benjamin Wilson, John Macfarlane and
 my Grandson John Jamieson Jonston, all my Hou-
 sehold furniture, Beds Blankets, Bed and table Linen,
 and every other Article considered as Household Effects,
 also all my plate of every kind to be equally divided
 between my said Sons immediately after my
 death share and share alike and such proportion
 To hold each of them my said Sons, and each

of thier heirs and Assigns for Ever; I give and
divise unto my Son, John Macfarlane, all those
five hundred Acres of Land, of mine Situated
and being at Great Ogechee in the
State aforesaid, adjoining a Certain Bluff thier
Call Indian Bluff, to his heirs and Assigns for
ever; I give and divise unto Mr. Martha Cook
all my washing Apparel; My cattle of all kinds
to be equally divided between, my sons, and Grand-
son as aforesaid to thier heirs and Assigns for ever;
All the Rest and Residue of my Estate Real and Per-
sonal, I give divise and Bequeath unto my Sons
Benjamin Wilson and John Macfarlane, to be
equally divided between them, and each of thier
heirs and Assigns, in equal parts, Shares and
proportions as Tenants in Common, and not
as Joint Tenants — I do hereby nominate,
constitute and Appoint my Friends, Leonard
Cicel Merchant and Doctor John Irvin,
Executors of this my Last Will and Testament
requesting them and each of them, to have my
Body Buried in a Decent and Christian,
manner, after my death not doubting that
my said Executors, will Execute this my Last
Will and Testament; And I do hereby revoke
all and every former Will and Wills by me
heretofore made — In Witness whereof, I the
said Susannah Macfarlane have to this my
last Will and Testament Written on three
sides and part of the fourth side of a Sheet
of Paper set my hand and Seal the tenth

day of September in the year of our Lord
one thousand seven Hundred and Eighty four
