 lying and being in the parish of St Philip, and

And adjoining each other, containing (more or less) six Hundred and fifty acres; I also Give and Bequeath unto my said Brother William Lee, all and every my Working Tools, and mechanical Instruments, the better to enable him to gain his Living in this world as also all and singular my Wearing apparel; To have and to hold, all and singular, the said Lots, Lands, and other things herein given unto my said Brother William Lee, his Heirs and assigns for ever. I Give, devise and Bequeath, unto my Sister Ann, all my right and Title of, in or to, Two Tickets, now in my possession, which Tickets are to be drawn out of the Lottery of the united States of America. - The prize money (if such be the chance) to my said Sister, Ann and her Heirs and assigns for ever, freely & clearly. I Give, Devise and Bequeath unto my Godson, Isaac Widdall, all that Tract of Land containing three Hundred acres, more or less, and is situate, as it is said near lands of Luke Mann, in Saint Philips Parish, aforesaid To have and to hold the said Tract of Land, with the appurtenances, unto the said Isaac Widdall, his Heirs and assigns for ever. I Give and Bequeath, unto my much Beloved Friend, John McSwain, my Bay Horse, known by the name of "Fiddlers Military Sash," from the great friendship, I bear him; I Give and Bequeath unto

John upon the Shewer, the sum of Fifty pounds
 lawful Money of this State, as a Testimony There,
 of his faithful Service, during his Apprenticeship
 with, and under me. And it is my Will, and
 I do hereby, Strictly charge and bind my Estate
 Real or personal, with the schooling maintaining
 and providing for my sister Rebecca Lee, untill she
 shall arrive at the age of Twenty One Years, or be
 Married which ever first shall happen; The said
 Rebecca Lee, to be brought up, and live with, and
 continue with my said dear Wife Mary Ann Lee.
 I Give devise and Bequeath unto my said dear
 Wife all the remainder of my Lands wheresoever
 they may be found, and lastly I do hereby
 nominate and appoint my said Wife Mary Ann
 Lee, Executrix; William Fox, the Elder, (my Brother
 in Law) and my Friends John McQuer, and William
 Stephens Executors of this my last will, and Testament,
