Personal, of every kind whatsoever, with
all Bills, Bonds, Notes of hand, & book
Debts, which shall or may be my property
or any ways likely to become me at the
time of my decease unto my Dear wife
Mary Finnew, for her sole use and property
without any reservation or Infringement
whatsoever except as hereafter, that is to
say all my first debts that I may have

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to pay at the time of my Decease with
all my funeral expenses to be paid first
out of my said property, and the
Remainder to be the sole property of my
said Dear wife Mary Kinder as above
specified -

And furthermore I do -
constitute and appoint my said Dear
wife Mary Kinder, to be my sole and
whole executrix of this my last will and
Testament utterly revoking all former
wills/as well as all deputations powers
of Attorney and authority to any other
person/ by me granted or made
so far as relates to the Disposal of my
Estate and property at the time of my
Decease, and making this only to be my
true last will and Testament.

And in Authority
of this I do hereby set my hand and
Seal this 26 Day of September 1703 -
and in the twenty third Year of the Reign
of our Sovereign Lord George the third by
the Grace of God, King of Great Britain
France and Ireland Defender of the faith.
