

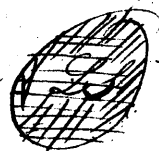

for that purpose, The remainder I

this place carpenter from the Love
have for him, if the regard he has
shown to me. Inwitness if my
brother John Thompson is alive I

Lastly I appoint Thomas Emerson executor
of John Gould's formerly of this place
Executor of this my last Will, signed
Sealed & Delivered at Savannah -
twenty third of March, one thousand seven
